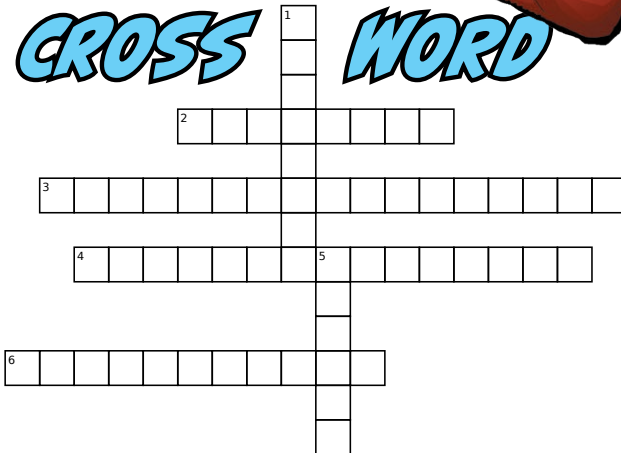

Across:

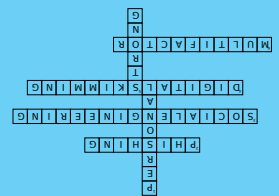
- Fake messages trying to trick you into giving information or clicking a dangerous link
